Post-Congress Sialendoscopy Lab — Limited Enrollment

INTENT AND OVERVIEW

The Second International Congress on Diseases of the Salivary Gland is designed to facilitate dissemination of knowledge and discussion of the most important aspects of salivary gland disease. This will be accomplished through an outstanding multidisciplinary international faculty. The meeting is formatted to allow formal presentation of important new information as well as panel discussions. The Congress will highlight new understanding of xerostomia, inflammatory and neoplastic diseases and new modalities such as sialendoscopy. Participants are encouraged to submit abstracts for consideration. These presentations may be oral or in poster format. After the Congress, we have scheduled a **laboratory course in sialendoscopy** (*limited enrollment - see page 14*).

OBJECTIVES

At the conclusion of the course, participants should be able to:

- Discuss new concepts in sialolithiasis
- Recognize opportunities in xerostomia
- Discuss management options in benign and malignant neoplasia
- Optimize new technologies, sialendoscopy, for patient care

WHO SHOULD ATTEND

This Congress has been designed for professionals interested in research in, as well as treatment of, diseases of the salivary apparatus. Special emphasis is directed toward research and treatment of diseases of salivary flow, neoplasia, obstruction, and sialolithiasis.
